ABCD Quilting Workshop and Annual Indoor Picnic

Monday, July 22, 2013:

There are still a few slots available for ABCD Quilting, a workshop presented by designer/teacher Kim Fauth; you can sign up at the June meeting. A supply list will be emailed to each participant and posted on the Web site. See the May newsletter for full details on what to expect (hint: \$35 and 1-1/2 yards of fabric will get you 32 blocks and a quilt in six hours). The workshop begins at 9:00 a.m. and runs until 3:00 p.m.

For those who don't want to go home before the 6:00 p.m. Picnic, you may bring your picnic food in the morning, put it in the refrigerator, and continue to sew until the picnic begins at 6:00. As usual, for the picnic, you're expected to bring your own table service (plates and silverware) plus a dish to pass. If your last name begins with A-M, please bring a salad. Those with last names beginning with N through Z, please bring a dessert. We'll furnish tea and lemonade; if you'd like a different beverage, please bring it. We will have ice and cups!

As always, we encourage you to bring any of the young quilters in your life. We'd love to meet them and see their "Show and Tells."

Specialty Rulers

Specialty rulers can be divided into two categories –those used for cutting fabric and those used for trimming blocks. They could equally well be divided into rulers you couldn't live without and those sitting around that you never use.

You know about the ones in that last category. They're the ones the teacher insisted you needed for the class then used it on only one block and never again.

Some of these rulers are so very special they only get used when making a certain type of block. Really, how many spider blocks are you going to make? At the time you were making the block the ruler was indispensable but you haven't used it since. OK- so here is my plug for the Prairie Star Quilt Guild's first ever, soon to be annual Garage Sale. Why not donate those rulers so another quilter can use them?

I'm asking you to write and tell me what is your favorite and your least favorite ruler and why. No individual names will be used. You can send the description to me at yrichter@juno.com or hand me your written description at a guild meeting or whenever you see me.


So here goes my contribution. My most favorite has to go to my Fit to be Geese ruler. I'm forever making those blocks and even though I forget how to use it if I've been away for a while, it doesn't take too long to get back to it. It allows me to get my finished block the exact size I need. My least favorite goes to the Tri-Recs Tools. They look like they would be


great for making 60° angles and half square triangles but the angles **aren't** 60°. Mine measures to be 52.5° for one ruler and 64.5° for the other. When I bought the ruler, the teacher told me the tip was cut wrong for trimming so it has been sitting in a drawer ever since. With the angles not being the normal angles I use in making blocks, I don't know it I would use it even if I went back and figured out how.

By the way, there are many instructional videos available on line on how to use rulers for those of us who have thrown out the instructions or still have them but can't follow them.

Email or write and let me know how you feel about your rulers - before Sister Sew & Sew comes back and uses them on your knuckles.


