#### **QUILT SHOW ENTRIES DUE!**

Yes, the deadline for quilt entry forms will come all too quickly now that June has arrived. The forms (with one color picture) are due no later than JULY 31! Since there has been a little confusion, let us clarify a few "rules":

- 1. Each guild member (dues paid) may enter up to 3 quilts into whichever categories they best fit. Of these 3, only 2 can be entered to be judged. In addition to these 3, each member may enter a 3D Challenge Quilt and a Bee Quilt if their bee has had a special project. Challenge Quilts do not need an entry form and are due Sept.
- 1. Bee quilts do need an entry form.
- 2. Each quilt (except Challenge Quilts) must have a 4 inch sleeve securely attached at the top of the back of the quilt and a label (including your name) at the lower left corner of the back.
- 3. We cannot display any quilts that are larger than 96 inches on any side. Sorry, we know they are beautiful.
- 4. Please, please, we would love to have at least one quilt from each member!

The June meetings will bring your first chance to sign up as a volunteer for the quilt show. Check your calendars to see when you could help us make our show a success from set-up on Wednesday and Thursday (Oct. 12 & 13) to working during the show on Friday and Saturday (Oct. 14 & 15).

Liz Coleman, Ginny Wright, and Diane Swaney-Smith have analyzed what they have already received for the Boutique, and discussed requests that were made by shoppers at previous shows. They have expressed a need for these items: Christmas and holiday items (including ornaments), aprons including children's aprons in modern colors, dog coats, American Girls clothes (or a cash donation so that we can purchase a gift card for the raffle basket), pin cushions and thread catchers, mesh or clear project bags, eyeglass cases, bibs, small sweet baby quilts, quilt tool carriers, tool charms, luggage tags, and big bags for carrying your mat, etc. to classes. 

#### **Card Keeper Door Gift**

1 - 8 ½ x 8 ½ fabric

- 1 8 ½ x 4 ¼ fusible interfacing
- 1. Fuse interfacing to the wrong side of fabric.
- 2. Fold in half right sides together and sew ¼" seam around leaving an opening to turn in the middle of the 8 ½' side.
- 3. Clip corners and turn right side out. Press turning opening 1/4".
- 4. Fold each end in 1
  ½" to make pockets.
  Then top stitch all
  the way around
  outside edge 1/8".
  Fold in half.

Note: You can also use two different fabrics each  $8 \frac{1}{2} \times 4 \frac{1}{2}$  and fusible interfacing  $8 \frac{1}{2} \times 4 \frac{1}{2}$  fused one of the fabrics. Sew all the way around as in step 2 then continue to steps 3 & 4.


