Fleece Marble Mazes

Fleece Marble Mazes are a quick project that are very helpful for children, including those on the autism spectrum. They can be calming, offer a way to help focus and are good therapy for those needing better finger/hand coordination.

Simply they are two pieces of fleece with a marble or large bead sewn in between with a pattern sewn on to push the marble around.

Size: Flexible but we recommend 7 1/2" by 9".

<u>Pattern:</u> Anything goes. I draw dots every $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " as a grid and then just connect the dots different ways, but you can use curves too, e.g. someone sewed a big figure "8". Below are some pictures of patterns.

Option: I have sometimes made one side of the fleece 7 ½" by 15" so it is longer than the maze part and have sewed a few different fabrics on that end and cut fleece on very end like around a tie blanket. This is adding a mini-fidget quilt on the side. You can only add this on one side so the child can still manipulate the marble thru the maze. An example is below on right.
