Join a Zoom (Virtual) Guild Meeting

Regular monthly Chapter meetings are continuing in August and beyond. The PM Chapter meeting will be August 24, 7 pm. The AM Chapter meeting will be Tuesday, August 25 at 9:30.

You will receive an email/Mail chimp invitation to both meetings. You can choose the one you want to attend or come to both!

Here is how to join a meeting!

- I. On the day of the meeting, starting no more than 15 minutes before the start time, open your email and click on the link.
- 2. The 'Launching' window opens. Start Zoom by:
 - · Clicking "Open Zoom Meetings?" if you have a Zoom account on your computer or phone

OR

• Click Cancel in the "Open Zoom Meetings?" box and click join from your browser at the bottom of the page.

Zoom Meeting Practice

If you missed the first couple of virtual meetings and this will be your first time attending, please contact the board (psqgboard@gmail.com) if you'd like to practice ahead of time.

We do not have a scheduled practice this month.

- 3. Enter your name.
- 4. Click the box next to "I'm not a robot".
- 5. Click the "Join" button when it lights up.
- 6. You will be given the choice of using your computer speaker and microphone or using your phone to call into the meeting.
 - a. To join with computer audio click the "Join Audio by Computer" button.
 - b. To join by phone, click the "Phone Call" button.
 - i. A list of phone numbers will be presented.
 - ii. Dial the number of your choice.
 - iii. When prompted, enter the:
 - I. Conference ID (with the # sign)
 - 2. Participant ID (with the # sign)
 - 3. Password (with the # sign)

The meeting window will open.

- 7. Click the video camera at the bottom of the screen to activate the camera on your computer.
 - A popup may present asking to use the camera, click Allow.
- 8. Click the microphone to activate your microphone.
 - please note that everyone who joins the meeting will be automatically muted due to the size of our group. To unmute, click the microphone on the screen to remove the red line.
- 9. You should see yourself on the meeting screen! Welcome to Zoom!!

Web Conferencing Best Practices

- Check your microphone & speaker settings before the meeting
- Plug your computer into a power source
- Use a headset in crowded/public spaces
- Mute your microphone when not actively speaking
- Be aware of your surroundings and behavior (We can see you!)
- Add questions/comments in "Chat" section to be addressed by moderators
- "Raise hand" if would like to address the group
- Make comments short and succinct, mute for responses



Number of entries

You all are the best! We will have judged and display quilts. Our final numbers (as of publication time) are 137 display and 38 judged plus the challenge quilts. I have heard from a few people who missed the deadline. We will leave the forms open until August 15, so get in while you can!

The submission forms are online. On our guild site psqg.org under the quilt show section you will find a tab for each entry category. For the judged quilts you can pay online right at the bottom of the form. If you would rather print the form and mail it in, that information is under the show section and member information. That applies to judged or display quilts.

Website

The website is still under construction; as soon as this newsletter is done I will work on the site. I plan to be ready to receive all those great entries from you at the end of the month.

The show will "go live" on October 9, 2020. We are still thinking about when it will end. Because it's online now, we don't have the restriction of only having our venue for 2 days.

Committee meeting

Our next committee meeting will be August 12 at 6:30 pm via Zoom.

Collection of sellable items

No more collections of things, please. At this time it looks like we may not be able to have any kind of big sale until late spring 2021, so the ladies are feeling a little buried. Contact the board if you're really

desperate to donate something, and we'll find it a home. For now, though, the collections stop.

We will be sending a survey regarding some ideas for sales, so keep an eye out for that.

Next steps

Regarding the final "drop off" of your quilts. Judged quilts will look much like you've seen before. There will be a date to drop them off at our judging location, probably October 4 as we would have done for the inperson show. The judge is scheduled for the morning of October 5. Once the judging is complete, pictures will be taken (with ribbons if appropriate) and we will schedule a time for you to pick up your quilts at that same location. What will the location be? We're hoping for the church, but we have to wait and see as we get closer. What will drop-off and pick-up be like? Again, we will know more as we get closer. Right now I would say we will probably have to schedule a certain number of people into time slots and your time would be the same on both days.

Display quilts do not ever need to leave your hands! "Drop-off" for these is turning in your final pictures by August 31. That will give us September to polish off the website. I will have information on the show website (2020quiltshow.psqg.org) regarding some tips on how to take a nice picture. We would like to have an overall picture of the whole front of the quilt, I or 2 closeups of the quilting, and optionally a picture of the back. This also means if you don't want to put a hanging sleeve on your display quilt, you don't have to. (We still need them on the judged quilts.)

Challenge quilts will also have to be "turned in" by September 13. We're giving you a little extra time on those. These will need a picture of the front of the quilt and a closeup of the quilting. We would like these to remain anonymous to the viewers so we can ask for voting on viewers choice. If the show runs longer than the typical 2 days, the voting will take place on October 9 & 10, with the winner announced on the 10th. Then I'll close the voting on the website and show which one is the winner.

Opportunity quilt

Tickets for our opportunity quilt are still for sale. \$I each or 6 for \$5. You, as members, can collect ticket money and send it to Chris Schwarz along with the ticket information (name & phone number). The drawing will take place on October IO even if the show runs longer than that. We will announce the winner, in semi-private fashion, on the website.

Thank you all so much for the beautiful quilt entries! Now I have my work cut out for me "hanging" all this art.

All these plans are subject to change, so please be patient as we work through this. Our highest priority is to keep everyone safe and we will work within the guidelines set by our state government as any scheduled things approach.

That is all for now. Please don't be afraid to contact us with questions. We will speak at the guild meetings just as we would at an inperson meeting. Keep sewing!


Hearts are woven EQ creation by Barb Vlack
