Modern Quilt Studio



Weeks Ringle and Bill Kerr are celebrating their 20th year as professional quiltmakers and cofounders of Modern Quilt Studio, a design studio in Oak Park, Illinois. Bill and Weeks are pioneers of the Modern Quilt Movement, having written the first book on Modern Quilting.

Their lecture at both meetings will be "What makes it modern?". Their workshop is called "Curved Piecing" and will be via Zoom in 2 parts. Watch the class and then participate in the live event.

Workshop: Curved piecing is scheduled on Saturday December 5th at 9:45. Class starts promptly at 10:00 am and runs until Noon.

All members who signed up for the workshop; if you desire to purchase supplies and kits, suggested patterns are included on the artists website at www.modernquiltstudio.com. Please note that the workshops are not kit-based, but optional. Some participants may choose to just follow along in the workshop. I received my pattern within 2 business days.

The class is delivered in a two part process.

- I) A prerecorded lecture and demonstration of at least I hour will be made available to the participants via YouTube unlisted link.
- 2) A live via zoom session of at least 2 hours.




