

Planning is proceeding on schedule. We have a meeting coming up on November 13 from 6-8pm at the Panera in Downtown Batavia. Everyone is welcome to attend.

Start sewing your challenge quilts, display quilts and judged quilts. We will strictly adhere to the deadlines for these items, so be ready to meet them, please. Soon we will have all the forms on the website.

#### **PSQG Youth Challenge**

We are planning a new category for the 2020 quilt show, a Youth Block Challenge. Volunteers are needed to help with the many aspects of accomplishing this. We need to decide the following: determine age groups, size of block, composition and/or color, how much help from adults, registration, sponsor's fee, awards or not, tallying votes, hanging of challenge blocks, manning booth during show and anything else you can suggest.

We are collecting at the meetings; please look for an open car trunk.

- Magazines from 2015-2020 (five years old).
- Patterns of any age are welcome, but please be mindful of copyright laws and don't include a photocopy you got from a friend.
- Other quilty items in good condition. Puzzles, rulers, longarm pantographs, embroidery files, etc.

#### Scraps

As a result of your generous donations of good-quality fabric, we have a serious head-start on getting scraps ready to sell at our quilt show next year. In fact, we have so much ready (think 800 folded fat quarters, for example) that we want you to have first choice at this good stuff. Soooo, we'll have a table at the Guild Sewin on Monday, November 25 and at both Guild meetings with a selection of fat quarters (50 cents apiece), scrap bags (\$1 apiece), and yardage (\$2/yard). In addition, we're trying something new! We'll have a large tub of fabric pieces that you can buy individually, at 25 cents per piece. Once you've taken advantage of this opportunity and cleared us out, we'll restock for the quilt show!

For now, let's hold off on fabric donations until January. Thank you!

#### **Quilt Show Boutique**

Our Boutique will be successful if you share some of your creative talents. We know you are out there creating as we've seen some lovely items at Show-And-Tell that would be perfect for the boutique. Please bring your items to the Quilt Boutique Table at the guild meeting. We'd love to see all the wonderful things you are doing. Small items, like hot pads, oven mitts, ornaments, and mug rugs, all sell well. Maybe you have some leftover fabric from your fall and Christmas projects this year that would be perfect for a boutique item?

#### **Door Gifts**

Collection is going great thanks to all of you very generous sewists. We will announce when we have reached our limit.

**One important note** -- as you're making the hand warmers, please use cotton thread. We've recently learned polyester can be a hazard in the microwave.

#### **Raffle Baskets**

Please keep perusing your sewing room for new or like-new items for the raffle baskets.

We need selvages. Selvages need to have I" of fabric in addition to the selvage, and they need to be I8" or longer. Please DO NOT remove selvages from fabric you intend to donate for the quilt show fabric scrap sales.

We are trying to accumulate enough basket items for a beginner long-arm quilter. So keep that in mind as you search.

### Why you should label your quilts: A personal story!

In 2013, I created a baby quilt for my great-grandson, Xavier Brennan, and sent it to him in Fort Collins, Colorado. Fast forward to November 6, 2019. That morning I received a text from my longarm quilter who found the following message posted on her Facebook page:

"I know this is a long shot, but I found a quilt that was quilted in 2013 by Bonita Deering from Prairie Shop Quilts. Susan and Herbert Strasser made the quilt for their great-grandson who lives in Fort Collins, CO - or at least did when he was born. I assume they still live here since that is where I found the quilt. Do any of these names ring a bell? I'm sure the family would love to have the quilt back and I'm doing everything I can to find them. Thanks."


Bonita Deering, my quilter, reached out to me, and I immediately emailed Katie Brennan, Xavier's mother, to ask if she was missing a quilt. She responded immediately with this message:

"Yes, yes, yes that is Xavier's quilt you made for him...Oh my gosh, I can't believe somehow you got informed about this. We had taken it to the park with us and I realized yesterday that it wasn't in the back of my van. I was going to go out looking for it today. What a blessing!! Please give your friend my contact info so I can swing by and get that beautiful, precious quilt back. Thank you so much Susan for emailing me about this!! I've been worried sick about this."

Bottom line: Thanks to a label and a very thoughtful fellow quilter, Xavier's quilt was back home very shortly after it was lost!

Quilters really do have a widespread caring community, don't we!


