Quilts of Valor: Please remember we like our tops at the minimum size at 58×68 . If it's not bordered, please sew I/8" around the perimeter of the top to hold the edges together.

If you want to sit back at the Community Table and get some good vibes, join us. It's awesome seeing our members come back there and ask how they can help!!!

EEEK! October is extra scary this year! 12 months and counting!

Start sewing your challenge quilts, display quilts and judged quilts. We will strictly adhere to the deadlines for these items, so be ready to meet them, please.

Challenge Quilts

Barb Vlack has announced the red & white challenge for the show. Sign up in person at a meeting for \$5 cash. The rules are available on our website (psqg.org/red-and-white-competition-rules/).

Opportunity Quilt

The quilt is traveling and ticket sales are underway. We ask that each member purchase \$20 in tickets. You can use those for yourself for more chances to win, or you can sell them to relatives or friends.

Quilty Resale

We are collecting at the meetings; please look for an open car trunk.

- Books, copyright 2000 to present.
- Magazines from 2015-2020 (five years old).
- Patterns of any age are welcome, but please be mindful of copyright laws and don't include a photocopy you got from a friend.
- Other quilty items in good condition. Puzzles, rulers, longarm pantographs, embroidery files, etc.



Scraps

We're starting the countdown to the quilt show with both collecting and selling events! At every guild meeting, we'll have a car in the parking lot with an open trunk for scraps collections. Please donate only quilt-store-quality scraps, no smaller than about 4-inches square. Yardage is also welcome. And since we've already collected some lovely things, we'll have a table at the November guild meetings to offer these items first to members. In addition to FQs and 1/4-yard pieces (\$0.50 each), we'll have some jelly rolls and fabric packs. Also available will be a stack of orphan blocks. We invite you to adopt one or more of these blocks and use them to practice free-motion quilting on your domestic machines. (You might even create a table runner or pillow for the Quilt Show boutique...)

Quilt Show Boutique

Our Boutique will be successful if you share some of your creative talents. We know you are out there creating as we've seen some lovely items at Show-And-Tell that would be perfect for the boutique. Please bring your items to the Quilt Boutique Table at the guild meeting. We'd love to see all the wonderful things you are doing.




