That quilt show summarizes this whole year of 2020. We've been thrown a huge curve ball, and have had to change the way we live. For me personally, I've been cooped up at home since March. I didn't drive for 5 months – and my first trip was to my longarmer. (You can see where my priorities are). I'm so thankful for Zoom and other ways to communicate virtually, but it's still been hard. First, months ago they had to make the decision to have a virtual quilt show. Make the appropriate cancelations of vendors, space, and then figure out HOW to have a virtual show. Create a website. How to set the voting options online. Create the ability to accept donations. All the behind the scenes work by the committee to get the quilts for judging, display, and challenge quilts coordinated. It was amazing.


