It Takes a Village to Raise a Guild

Fall is just around the corner, bringing with it cooler weather, colorful trees, and the aromas of pumpkins and burning leaves. Fall also brings (drum roll, please) the beginning of a new school year! This means that moms (and grandmas, too) just may have a little more time. Let me suggest a few ways that you could use a little bit of that time to help our guild.

Our guild depends volunteers-from Board members who take on big jobs, to those who work on committees, to those who simply pitch in when needed. It is "the pitch-in-when-needed" part that I want to talk about now. I understand that a commitment to take on a job that requires you to be available every month for a guild meeting is difficult for some of you. That's why I'm listing opportunities that require only a single meeting (or a couple of meetings) commitment.

• Show and Tell help. We all enjoy the parade of quilts each meeting, but it takes time to help hold and fold those beautiful items. The same people seem to be doing it meeting after meeting. If several of you could volunteer for a

If you don't see a vehicle, then bring them inside and stack them by the freebie table in the open closet. If you need more cases, we will continue to have them at the Community Service Table.

New Community Service Project: The Neonatal Intensive Care Unit of Central DuPage Hospital uses unbatted blankets to cover the incubators for premature babies. The blankets muffle noise and darken the environment. They need to be 36" x 48" with flannel on one side and minky type fabric

Quilts of Valor: Please remember we like our tops at the minimum size at 58 x 68. If it's not bordered, please sew I/8" around the perimeter of the top to hold the edges together.

Challenge Quilts

Opportunity Quilt

The quilt is traveling and ticket sales are underway. We ask that each member purchase \$20 in tickets. You can use those for yourself for more chances to win, or you can sell them to relatives or friends.

We will start collecting scraps in September. Please remember that we're looking for quilt shopquality fabric. As in previous years, we will have a pre-sale just for our membership. Listen at the meetings for details and dates.

Our Boutique will be successful if you share some of your creative talents. Perhaps you took a class and learned a new technique? Maybe you make a special item that you find makes quilting even more fun. Do you combine quilting with embroidery to embellish items? Do you excel at making zipper pouches, organizers, or beautiful bags? We know you are out there creating as we've seen some lovely items at Show-And-Tell that would be perfect for the boutique. Please bring your items to the Quilt Boutique Table at the guild meeting. We'd love to see all the wonderful things you are doing.

Door Gifts

As of the August PSQG meetings, we now have a total of 500 door gifts for the quilt show. I was informed at the meeting, that we have an overstock of door gifts from the previous quilt shows. Therefore, once we reach 1,000 hand warmer door gifts, we will no longer be collecting them. We will supplement with the overstock door gifts if we need to.



She'll touch on fabric options, placement and the unlimited design potential to make a finished original quilt. Katie will have multiple inspiring examples of how you and these quilt blocks can play together.
