The Guild in the time of Covid

"May you live in interesting times". Many of us have heard that statement believed to come from a Chinese curse or proverb . This past year-actually 13 monthscertainly has been an interesting time. From complete lock down to vaccinations and things beginning to open up more, the world has changed. Many things will never go back to the way they were before. We have all been stressed—some by lack of socialization, others by being ill themselves, and still others by losing friends or family to Covid. This pandemic has been compared to the Spanish Influenza crisis of 1918-1920, where the estimate of deaths is 50 million. So far, the estimate of deaths due to Covid stands around 132 million, but in many countries the numbers are still going up.

Many businesses and activities have been shut down and may never re-open or resume. I'm very proud of our Guild for finding ways to continue to move forward. Through the use of technology, we have been able to have meetings, workshops, and retreats. The shut down hasn't stopped us from making quilts for Quilts of Valor, CASA, and Ronald McDonald house or making marble mazes for those who need them. In addition, we've made thousands of masks for hospital workers and first responders. Throughout everything, we have continued to foster our mission of providing Education, Fellowship, Inspiration, and Service to our community.

There will be changes as we move forward—that is inevitable. The survey results show many of you have adapted to the changes we have had to make. Some never want to hear the word ZOOM again. Personally, I like being able to hear the speaker without the chatter of others in the background. No, you don't get to see the quilts up close and personal, but how many of our 350 members volunteer to hold up the quilts and walk them around the room?

Will Zoom meetings, workshops, and retreats continue? Definitely YES for the time being. The Church is willing for us to continue meeting there in person but ONLY when Illinois gets to level 5. Not only do we




