Pizza anyone?



Well, pizza boxes anyway. We learned from Carol Wilhoit in January that pizza boxes are a great storage option for quilters. We will be selling

16" pizza boxes at the library table during the February meetings. Stop by and pick up a few!

Community Service

Plastic Bags for homeless beds: Ladies tell me they are still loaded with bags. Joyce will take a finished mat as long as it's 3 feet by 6 feet.

Dog Beds: Please bring your completed dog beds to the next meeting. Please be sure your pet beds are a MINIMUM of 24" on EACH SIDE, larger is ok, up to 40". Do NOT leave bags of scraps with the pet beds at the Church. If you have scraps, use them to make a pet bed (we have fabric for the case) or if they are large enough, save them for the Quilt Show scrap collection later this fall. Look for a car/van parked under the canopy and place your beds there. If you don't see a vehicle, then bring them inside and stack them by the freebie table in the open closet. If you need more cases, we will continue to have them at the Community Service Table.

NICU Blankets: The Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) of Central DuPage Hospital uses unbatted blankets to cover the incubators for premature babies. The blankets muffle noise and darken the environment. They need to be 36" x 48" with flannel on one side and

minky type fabric on the other (no fleece). Thank you for the generous donations of fabric for our kits; we do not need more fabric donations at this time. For questions, contact Linda Stoynoff 630-444-III5 or lstoynoffI@att.net.

Hospice Bears: Memory Are you interested in learning how to make the stuffed teddy bear that our Service branch makes for hospice? Nancy Krasinski will be teaching a class on their creation. The class will include general sewing directions, fabric layout suggestions, and timesaving construction tips. Ronald McDonald quilts: We gave out about 25 kits in January. 8 or 9 tops came in from the November kits. We know we may not see an influx of returns until Spring, and we are fine with that!

For the February Meetings, we will have around 38 to 50 kits to

hand out. We expect that not all those will be taken, but that's fine. We just want to always be a bit ahead on the kits than behind!

Quilts of Valor: I'd like to first thank the guild for the donation that came from the November Sew-In. Your donations of money, fabric, and time does not go unnoticed! And thank you for what you are doing for our Veterans. I brought home 20 finished quilts from the January meetings! Our guild members really like to bind — I still have quilts for binding if you're interested.

We just received confirmation that at the July 2021 evening meeting we will be awarding our own veterans again...save the date. It's never too early to start thinking of the veterans in your life; put his/her name(s) in for nomination on the forms that I will have after this year's quilt show. Pick a pattern, make the quilt, have it quilted ready to go! Remember in order to have a QOV (copyright) label, minimum finished size is 55 x 65, maximum 72 x 92.




