Because we do a lot of presentations with multiple veterans, we make our tops the minimum size. So, unquilted,

we ask that tops be 58" x 68" as quilting tends to shrink the top.

Shelly Cavanna of Cora's Quilts



Shelley Cavanna is a quilter, teacher, author, and textile and quilt designer.

She opened her first independent design company under the banner of Poplun Designs – the Croatian word for quilt – and in 2013 she decided to re-brand, and re-open as Cora's Quilts!

So, who is Cora, then? In truth, no one! She loved the name ever since she fell in love with The Last of the Mohicans in high school. It's a lovely nod to her Irish heritage and her love of historical novels!

Cyndi McChesney of Cedar Ridge Quilting



Cyndi McChesney has been fascinated with quilts and quilt-making for most of her life. In the late 1970s she enrolled in a beginning quilting class, and the journey of love and passion for this time-honored tradition and craft began. She went on to open her own quilt store in New Hampshire in the early 1980s where she taught a variety of quilting classes and made custom quilts for customers and galleries throughout the northeast.

A move to Colorado in 1983 led her to teach quilting classes for Colorado Mountain College and small quilt shops in the Rocky Mountains. Today Cyndi is a teacher at First Stitches in Canon City and Pueblo, CO, lectures and teaches at guilds and shows throughout the US, and operates her long-arm business from her home studio.

In 2011, Cyndi achieved the

distinguished title of National Quilt Association Certified Teacher and in 2015 was awarded National Quilt Association Teacher of the Year. She has won awards for her quilts in the Hoffman Challenge (2010), the Hoffman Challenge Traveling Exhibits (2011-2013), the Colorado State Fair (2009-2014), NQA Annual Show (2013), Quilt Colorado (2014), Visuals#I Mancuso Show (2020), and in 2012 was one of three Invitational Exhibitors at Interquilt 2012 in Girona, Spain.

In 2012, Cyndi was inducted into the Colorado Quilt Council Hall of Fame. Cyndi has been a repeat guest on TheQuiltShow.com, and her show on Panel Palooza aired in 2017. As a return guest, Cyndi presented a program on drafting quilt blocks from pictures and photographs. Cyndi's passion for quilt making is evident in comments from her students and in her neverending quest to find new techniques and skills to share with others.

Cyndi will be with us virtually for our Chapter Meetings on Monday, September 27 and Tuesday, September 28 with her Panel Palooza Lecture & Trunk Show.


