Joy specializes in applique patterns that are easy, fun, and nature-inspired that all quilters are capable of making.

Her latest passion is bamboo felt applique which allows those that are allergic to wool, or that don't have the budget for it, to create beautiful, fun pieces of art.

Monday night's lecture will be "Stitches in Public". A fun look at how people see our pastime as everything but what we are actually doing.

Tuesday morning is "Making it Your Own". A look at how we can take a pattern and make simple changes that will personalize it.

This class allows you to explore the fun of working with bamboo felt and embroidery stitches. This is a workshop option to just dip your toes into the techniques for those that have not worked with bamboo felt before.

Virtual Workshop: Applique Elements Saturday, October 30th Ipm – 4pm \$30 Members \$35 Non-Members

This is a technique class where you learn the basics of fusible applique, buttonhole stitch, stem stitch, and ladder stitch along with seeing how to "birth" a quilt instead of using a binding to finish it off.

Pattern is not included in workshop price. Joy will be including an additional page with your pattern explaining how to transform a bamboo felt pattern to use with cotton fabrics and fusibles. Information to purchase and the supply list will be sent to registered participants.





After numerous years in the corporate world, Robin decided to


