## Tina Curran

Tina's interest in making art quilts was jump-started by seeing her dear friend Sara take a variety of patterned fabrics, cut them

into pieces and combine them in such an artistic way. As a life-long sewer (having experienced her first sewing triumph with a skating skirt she made in Girl Scouts), she took to quilting quickly. One of the great thrills with this art form is that her options are as infinite as those of a painter working on canvas landscapes, portraits, geometric patterns, abstract impressions, etc. She enjoys both the deep American roots of traditional quilting and the unlimited possibilities today's art quilts present. Combining elements of both extremes is great fun, as she often uses contemporary fabrics in century-old quilt patterns.

While she has no formal art training, she has taken some wonderful classes over the years. However, she knows her greatest learning has come in the over 10,000 hours she has spent making more than 125 art quilts to date. And it is exciting to realize that there seems to be no end to this learning curve.

Tina will present two different Zoom based lectures for us.

**Monday:** My Excellent Adventure as a Quilter.

**Tuesday:** My Design Process – From Concept to Quilt.

This workshop features several variations on a herringbone quilt. Participants can choose to make either a 20" quilted pillow or a 40" x 50" quilt. Students are amazed at how easily these quilts are constructed—they look more complicated than they are.

Tina offered a block-of-themonth program in 2018, releasing the pattern for each 18" block over the course of nine months. The individual blocks can be used in quilts or made into 20" quilted pillows.

The houses can be embellished to further dress them up for the holidays. She likes to add beads as stand-ins for Christmas lights on these tiny homes — for example, spelling out "Noel" on one roof. She also added a wreath on one door, a swag of garland with bows on another house and candles in the window of a third.




