What do we want?

Books: Quilt related, Copyright year 1990 and newer is best. If you include older than 1990, those books will be donated or recycled as we see fit. Please take a moment and flip through your books, as I have found carbon copies of personal checks, bills, children's handmade

drawings, and more. I do my best to remove these things, but having you check too will be best. If your donation has a musty smell, ripped cover, spilled drink stain, etc. please do not donate it. We want to resell these items and want the book to be appealing to the buyer.

Patterns: Any patterns of all shapes and sizes! These sell very well. We cannot resell a pattern that you have copied from a friend, so please keep those for yourself or recycle.

Magazines: We used to take any and all magazines that you kindly donate. We have found that magazines do not sell well these days. (And they are very heavy!). Most of us probably are already subscribed to the main titles. That being said, we will still collect the most recent 5 years of any titles. (2017-2022). It would be so helpful to me if you could limit your donations to those years.

ETC: At our last sale we happened to have items other than those listed above and they were very well received. We had quilt-related puzzles, machine embroidery items, longarm pantographs, and hand quilting stencils. We are opening up this category to include anything reasonable and quilt-related such as threads, beads, buttons, rulers, notions, etcetera!


