This class will be a combination of sharing how he would quilt your quilt and learning to draw and make designs for quilting. Bring your quilt and Jamie will take a picture at the beginning of class and use technology to show how he would quilt it for each workshop participant. Send your quilt picture before class to Diane M.

Also, bring several sharp pencils, eraser(s), and a drawing pad with many pages. He will teach you to draw and begin to build muscle memory for movement patterns to make a variety of quilt designs. Whether you're quilting on a domestic machine, a mid-arm, or a long arm, you will have a great experience in this workshop.


NICU Isolette covers, marble mazes & Fidget Quilts are always in need. Kits available! Contact Linda P.




