Thank you so much for all you do for our community and the guild's programs!

Fidget quilts and marble mazes are needed for several local care centers. Kits are available at the meetings or you can check out the PSQG Community Projects webpage for videos and size requirements to make them from your own stash. NICU isolette blanket kits are also available. If you need a kit or have questions, please contact Linda S.

Residential Hospice in Lisle asks for quilts and comforters for their patients. Pin a note to the item if it's been washed (unscented detergent, no softener is preferred). They will also accept fidget quilts and marble mazes. Contact Sheila C.

The Quilts for Kids program is looking for sports fabrics from anywhere in the US given that the kids at Shriner's Hospitals come from all over the country. College sport fabrics are okay too. 


