

Potato Chip Block Variations (one last step down the rabbit hole)

Arrange the potato chips in a brick formation. Add 2 1/2" half square triangles (HST) of an accent fabric and a background fabric that you can orient in all sorts of ways. Fill in the rest of the rows with 2 1/2" squares and potato chips of background fabric.

With standard potato chips (2 1/2" x 4 1/2") this produces a rectangular block 14 1/2" x 16 1/2".

Additional variations:

Add 1 1/2" background strips to the top and bottom of the block to make it 16 1/2" square.

Turn a potato chip of accent fabric into a flying geese block by using 2 1/2" squares of background fabric as flipping corners on each side. Add more background pieces to complete a row, and add this row to the top and/or bottom of the block. Turn any potato chip into a flying geese block the same way.

 = Potato chip (2 1/2" x 4 1/2")

 = Potato chip of background fabric (2 1/2" x 4 1/2")

 = HST (2 1/2") of accent fabric and background

 = Background square (2 1/2")
