#### FALL IS CLEANING AND LEARNING TIME

It's August. For me that means time to review my quilting practice as the kids return to school. This is essential to continue to produce finished projects, keep my skills sharp, and my quilting space productive.

First, I determine how many quilting projects I am actively interested in working on and where I am in that process. I create a master list of about ten items that I am in the middle of. I keep this list updated on a white board so I know where I am, at a glance, in any project.

Second, I ask myself, "how is my quilt space working for me? Are the pertinent elements of my craft positioned in the most ideal places in my room?" I practice several crafts that all share the same space, so I need to be sure all of the items work nicely together. I regularly tame and contain the bins of colorful collectibles that overflow their spaces.

With current projects and physical space in order, it is time to reacquaint myself with collected books, patterns and magazines brimming with new ideas.

Reading the articles gets me excited to learn new skills, and that's where our guild comes in!

Our speakers are teachers! That is why we have them visit us. We hear a lecture, but if that is all you do, you are missing out! I encourage you to take a class and allow your skills to go to the next level. Does your stomach get 'butterflies' when you read about our next class being offered? Good! That is a sign that you need to be there! Are you afraid that you won't understand the material? Don't worry! We are in a class with peers who will help us over the hurdle. Are you thinking that you don't need another PhD (Project half Done)? Then don't start a whole new quilt. Turn your learning piece into a pillow or table topper.

I hope you will join me in supporting our guild by attending our workshops. If we eliminate workshops due to non-attendance, we may lose the ability to hear certain lecturers. Some speakers will only lecture if they also teach a workshop.

Going back to school in August is not just for the children. It is for all of us who love to learn. Won't you join me in welcoming our speakers to our corner of the world where we can learn at our own pace?

#### New! Youth Challenge

The Prairie Star Quilt Guild is excited to announce a new category for our 2022 Quilt Show!

A guild member can sponsor and help one or more youth(s) create a block for this new and exciting



category in the show. This is an unquilted piece, just a flimsy block. The block will be displayed at the 2022 quilt show in October.

There will be three age groups: K through 4th grade, 5th grade through 8th grade, 9th through 12th grade. The 12" block (unquilted) can be an original design or based on an existing pattern. Adhesive may be used, but the block must include either hand or machine stitching. There will be a \$5 entry fee, paid by the sponsoring guild member. A sign up form is on the website.

The finished 12" block can be submitted to either Beth Koos or Susan Plaster at the September guild meeting with the entry form pinned to the quilt block. An admission ticket to one day of the show will be given to the contestant.

### Barbara Eckmeier

Barbara learned to sew in 4-H and made her first quilt while in high school but didn't start quilting seriously until after her marriage in 1984. She has been teaching quilting since 1990 and her favorite technique is applique.

Married to a military man, quilting became her portable career as they moved around the country and to South Korea for military assignments.

She is the mother of two, grandmother of one, and author of four quilting books. Barbara is a fabric designer for Paintbrush Studio Fabrics, a pattern designer, a Craftsy instructor, and she presents programs and workshops to guilds around the country.

Barbara lives in Lansing, Kansas with her husband and two dogs. In addition to quilting she enjoys flower



gardening, baking pies, writing, and sailing on their vintage sailboat at nearby Perry Lake.

## Kathy Steere

Kathy Steere has been creative her entire life. The form of expression changes with her stage of life: doing craft kits as a child, making floral displays for work, leading scout projects and activities, visualizing flag routines as a color guard instructor, drawing for botanical art, and always, teaching. Kathy can draw, teaches drawing, and has always found coloring to be very restful.

She tripped into quilting in 2007. It did not take long for her to realize matching points and accurate 1/4" seams were not in her future. Free-motion quilting, though, was drawing using a needle and a power tool.

An art friend introduced Kathy to water-soluble crayons. While researching how to improve her technique on canvas, she discovered the crayons could be used on fabric. After much trial and error, more research, and practice, Kathy has figured out how to "color in the lines" on fabric.

Kathy Steere is an awardwinning artist who enjoys sharing her knowledge with others and genuinely wants her students to feel successful.

Kathy will present two lectures and three workshops!

The evening lecture will be "Colored Wholecloth and More". This trunk show/power point presentation will "go behind the curtain" and show the process of making select art quilts. You'll see how several different techniques come together to make the final piece – and how sometimes the best results come from messing up!

What is "colored wholecloth"? There are three basic steps: I) Find/make a line drawing and transfer it to a single piece of cloth (taught in "The Illusion of Drawing" workshop).
2) "Poof" out selected areas using machine trapunto (see "Cookie Cutter Faux Trapunto" workshop).
3) Then pull out your inner child and color! ("Color Blending Basics" workshop)

The morning lecture will be "Life is a River - one artist's tale".

No, I did not grow up quilting at my grandmother's side. Nor did I paint at my grandfather's knee You'll hear about some of the twists and



turns that brought me to the point now of being an artist who quilts.

Kathy's 3 workshops will be:

- · The Illusion of Drawing
- · Cookie Cutter Faux Trapunto
- · Color Blending Basics

#### FEATURED BOARD POSITIONS

Over the next few months, we will be presenting a short summary of what the board positions entail in hopes that you will, if asked, consider accepting a position on the board. Our nominations position is open for this new year.

Our fiscal year starts in June each year, with elections held in April.

**President:** This is one of our 2 year positions and must be someone who has previously served on the board.

- Facilitates board meetings (which are now held via Zoom),
- Reviews and signs all Guild legal documents and contracts,
- Fills in at Guild meetings when VP's aren't available,
- Conducts the annual election for the Guild's Board of Directors.

#### Activities:

The Activities chair position has been responsible for scheduling quilt retreats, organizing the Quilts of Valor ceremony that occurs every other year in July, and planning/organizing the annual May banquet.

The best part of this position is connecting with members in the guild and making new friendships. This is a position that is not very restrictive, you can really make it your own as you serve the members of the guild.

This next year I will be planning multiple retreats throughout the year in the hopes that we will provide something for everyone. I welcome anyone (and everyone) to join with me in planning, and spreading the word about activities at the meetings!

#### Nominations:

The Nominations Chair is responsible for preparing a slate of members who are interested in and willing to serve in available board positions for the following year. It helps to know what is involved in each of the board positions so that an appropriate nominee can be found.

In my experience in this position, guild members help by suggesting the names of people they think would be a good fit for a certain job. Members also may always nominate themselves. You need to be able to hear "no" as an answer but still press on to ask other people.

This can be a great job for encouraging new people to get involved with the board. The Nominations Chair is also responsible for making sure board position job descriptions are correct.


#### NEWSLETTER NEWS


