### TAG SALE IN SEPTEMBER

Hi All,

Some of you may know that I have been interested in having a guild sale of member's items. Members have expressed interest in this idea for a few years and I think this is the right time to give it a try. We are a year away from our own guild show, so this seems like the moment to get people to start cleaning out their sewing rooms. They can give selling their own items a try in September. And maybe what doesn't sell could be collected by the show committees for next year as a kickoff for donations, if the seller agrees. I have secured Saturday, September 30 at the Illinois Extension Center on Randall Road for this event. We will have the whole day for arranging, set-up, sale and clean-up. I imagine the sale hours to be from IO am to 2 pm. The cost of renting the building is \$100. I suggest that we aim for IO sellers that will each pay \$10 to cover the cost. That price may change as we add more sellers or do not have enough.

Once the sale is announced, I will take the first 10 people who pay the \$10. After that, we will have a waiting list. I haven't been out to this location in a number of years, so I am not certain of the best number of tables and sellers to have. The woman I spoke to, Carrie, thought no more than 12 would be right. After I return from Connecticut I will visit and see how it looks. Those of you who are part of the MakeItTakeIt event might let me know if you have a suggestion for how many tables of sellers would be comfortable.

I am open to suggestions and volunteers who might like to help me facilitate this event for our guild!

# JANIS GORSKI OF BESPOKED QUILTS: A QUILT SHOW ABOUT MENTAL HEALTH

This lecture will be presented in person at both August meetings.

Janis has been an original design quilter for over fifteen years. Inspired by personal events, social issues and geography, she looks for the oddities of everyday life. Her color and design aesthetic are intuitive and subconsciously driven. One of a kind quilting allows her the freedom to communicate in her own special language. She is passionate about textiles and color and creating something novel.









MJ Kinman's passion is creating quilts inspired by beautiful gems. The key is freezer paper and MJ is delighted to share her technique with students.

MJ's work has been exhibited at the National Quilt Museum, the International Quilt Museum, the New England Quilt Museum, Quilt Festival (Houston, TX), Quilt Week (Paducah, KY), and Festival of Quilts (Birmingham, UK). Her work is included in collections as varied as Maker's Mark Distillery, the National Quilt Museum (Paducah, KY) and the International Quilt Museum (Lincoln, NE), plus many private collections around the United States.

MJ's popular Birthstone Series patterns feature traditional birthstone gems, and her Diamond Divas Series offer large, artistic quilts easily customizable by makers. Her first book, Gemstone Quilts, was released by C&T Publishing in 2020.



# Help Needed: 2024 Quilt Show Chairs and Other Responsibilities

The Quilt show provides the quilt guild with the funding to do the many programs and community service projects that we have all grown to love. We are thankful for those who have already volunteered to help, but we need YOUR help to have a successful show. Please consider volunteering for one of the positions below.

For more information or to volunteer contact Liz Fitzgerald, Yvonne Richter, or Diana Sharp.

#### **Books/Magazines/Patterns**

Collect and sort donations from members for about I2 months before the show. Regularly ask for and accept donations at quilt guild meetings. Transport materials, set up and oversee (with volunteers) sales area at the show. Appropriately dispose of unsold items at end of show.

#### Boutique

Collect, sort, and price donations from members for about 12 months before the show. Regularly ask for and accept donations at quilt guild meetings. Transport materials, set up and oversee (with volunteers) sales area at the show. Return unsold items at end of show.

#### Opportunity Quilt – Ticket Sales and Display

Arrange for quilt to be shown at various venues at which to sell tickets to "win" the quilt (quilt guilds, shop hops, bees, etc.). Manage volunteers to take quilt to venues and sell tickets and hand out bookmarks for quilt show admission discount. Print materials for tickets and bookmarks. At the quilt show, provide ballots, draw winning ticket, and arrange delivery of quilt to winner following identification.

#### Scraps

Collect, sort, and organize quilting fabric from guild members. Hold work days, as needed, for organizing and marking fabric. Manage pre-sales (if any) at guild meetings. Plan Scraps venue display area and gather needed display items. Transport materials, set up and oversee (with volunteers) sales area at the show. Appropriately dispose of unsold materials at end of show.



### CONTRACTS/PROGRAMS CHAIR REMAINS OPEN

As you can see on the calendar, we do not have speakers lined up for 2024. The Contracts/Programs Board position remains open.

The position is broken down into smaller chunks, so the time commitment is lessened. It's a perfect opportunity for a Bee or another group of quilters to come together and help us continue to provide the guild with wonderful speakers. In this age of everything available at our fingertips, it is easy to find a quilter you admire, investigate their lecture offerings and fees, and reach out to ask if their calendar is open for one of our available dates.

Can you find a quilter you would like to meet? A quilter or sewist you have always wanted to learn more about? If just a few members would each pick one month to cover, we could fill the calendar in no time. In return, you would get to talk with and host someone whom you might not meet under other circumstances.

Contact the board if you can help. Just a one-month commitment with one speaker would help immensely. Thanks!




