Kim Pedersen of NWM Marionjoy sent a thank you letter to Linda S. (it has been edited):

Dear Prairie Star Quilt Guild. I want to thank you so much for the work you have put into making marble mazes for the patients. Patients that come here often need to relearn how to use their hands and minds again and these mazes help them work on both of those areas. I just wanted to make sure you all know the positive impact you are making on the journey to healing and wellness for many of our patients. Fidget quilts and marble mazes are needed! Kits are available or you can check out the PSQG Community Projects webpage for videos and size requirements to make them from your own stash. NICU isolette blanket kits are also available. If you need a kit or have questions, please contact Linda S.

Residential Hospice in Lisle asks for quilts and comforters for their patients. Pin a note to the item if it's been washed (unscented detergent, no softener is preferred). They will also accept fidget quilts and marble mazes. Contact Sheila C. if you have items.

Thank you to the supporters of our Quilts for Kids Program. **This is also a gentle reminder that the hospitals do not want kids quilts larger than 40" x 52".** Batting donations are welcomed! Please contact Sandi W. if you have any questions. Port pillows are attached to the underside of a crossbody seatbelt and positioned over the patient's infusion port. The pillows are given to Phil's Friends, a local organization that supports those affected by cancer. Kits are available, although you can use fabric, stuffing, and hook & loop from your own stash. 

Aunt Margaret's Scrap Basket Workshop

Join the fun at the March 24, 2025 workshop, Aunt Margaret's Scrap Basket. Work on these new techniques from 9 am to 3 pm for \$65. This will be our first workshop for the 2025 year. Learn some new half square triangle techniques and enjoy a day of fun sewing with friends, new and old.

Chris Schulte from Green Light Quilts will be teaching a full day workshop on Monday. She guarantees to instruct and entertain us for the day. At the workshop you will make one block. From this block you can make 20 blocks for a quilt, 4



blocks for a table topper or 1 block for a wall hanging. The possibilities are endless.

In addition to the half square triangle, raw edge applique will be used to make the flowers, blossoms, and leaves.

Have some fun and register for the workshop to show Chris what a great guild we have.


ETIQUETTE REMINDERS

Get more involved with your guild. It's the time to start searching for the new board members who will take over in June 2025.


I am stepping down as newsletter chair, and there are also several other open positions that need to be filled. Please talk to our Nominations chair, Sue P., if you are interested in filling a position.
