Being the new year, we often want to start new habits. Anyone here working on losing weight for the past few weeks? Writing a journal? Cleaning out a cupboard each day? I'd like to walk some number of minutes each day, increasing as I march into spring. Perhaps you are thinking about your quilting life and have made goals for this new year

If not, I would encourage you to think about this quilting endeavor of ours. Take a moment and think

about this past year. Did you take a class to learn a new skill? Did you watch a video to guide yourself to new and better techniques. Sometimes we read an article or book to try a new pattern. Have you done this? At times we fall into a groove that has us remaking the same pattern over and over because we know it well. There is nothing wrong with that, of course. I would like to encourage you to look back over the past twelve months and think about where your quilts are taking you. If you did not stretch at all, maybe you could this year. Possibly working in a bit of a color you do not usually use would be enough of a challenge.

But even more, I would like to urge you to pick one project and finish it. Yep. I said it. I am not advocating the method where you write down your top twelve UFO's and work on one each month. How many of you have actually gotten to the end of the year and completed twelve projects? I'd like to know how you kept that motivation going.

Join us via Zoom in January for Pat Speth and Nickel Quilts!

Pat Speth began quilting in 1988 when she purchased a wool quilt batting from her Grandmother's auction. "I checked out a stack of quilt books from the library and fell in love with the patterns and designs, I knew I could not stop with just one quilt."

Pat started working with 5 inch squares as a basis for her quiltmaking in 1993 after attending her first retreat. She was asked to do a program for her guild in 1997 using the 5" squares, which gave her the push to explore new uses and techniques for working with the squares. Pat, while working a full time job, started on the book, Nickel Quilts in 1998 and was able to have it ready for the publishers in June 2001.

After juggling her full time job and her quilting for many years, Pat moved into a full time quilting career in July 2003. "I have found my passion in life, and I can't imagine doing anything else."

She will present two lectures in January, Five Inch is a Cinch on Monday, January 27, and Nickel Borders on Tuesday, January 28. Both lectures are via Zoom.

Chris Schulte from Green Light Quilts will be teaching a full day workshop on Monday. She guarantees to instruct and entertain us for the day. At the workshop you will make one block. From this block you can make 20 blocks for a quilt, 4



blocks for a table topper or 1 block for a wall hanging. The possibilities are endless.

In addition to the half square triangle, raw edge applique will be used to make the flowers, blossoms, and leaves.

Have some fun and register for the workshop to show Chris what a great guild we have.




