I. Go to the PSQG website.

3. Press the Book List button.

4. Which takes you to Library Thing, our on-line card catalog.

5. Use the "Search your library" search bar in the upper right corner of your screen. I searched for Quiltfolk, Issue 15.

6. Click on the title to read a few more details. This system only tells you if we own the book. You are not able to reserve the title.

7. Success, we own the book! At the next in-person meeting, stop by the library to borrow it.

Ohio native Meg Cox has been earning her living as a writer since graduating from

Northwestern University. She was hired as a staff writer by the Wall Street Journal, and worked at the WSJ in Chicago and New York for 17 years. While at the Journal, Meg contributed hundreds of frontpage stories and was lauded for her feature writing. Her beats included financial futures, agriculture, the business of the arts, and publishing.

Meg has written for many national magazines, lectured and taught all over the country and authored five books. She continues to contribute weekend arts features to the Wall Street Journal.

Her two main specialties are FAMILY TRADITIONS and QUILTING, two wildly misunderstood topics. Both are thought to be old-fashioned and unhip, which could not be farther from the truth.

The 21 million American quilters who have built this burgeoning craft into a \$3.6 billion industry are educated, computer-literate and fiercely creative.

Meg Cox

Meg's writing and lecturing on FAMILY TRADITIONS is informed by her experience as a mother, stepmother and step-grandmother, as well as more than a decade of interviewing psychologists, religious leaders and hundreds of families about rituals.

Her expertise on QUILTING stems partly from the 25 years that she has been a passionate quilter. Additionally, Meg served on the board of the national nonprofit Quilt Alliance for IO years and was president for 6 years. She writes a popular free monthly e-newsletter called Quilt Journalist Tells All. See her commentary on modern quilting in the hit 2011 documentary, Stitched.

What do all Meg's books have in common? They are so jampacked with practical information & inspiration, that readers' wellthumbed copies are bristling with bookmarks and Post-It notes.

Meg will explain the different requirements for formal quilt photos versus social media snapshots, sharing photos of celebrity quilters and their tips and tricks. She'll provide specifics about things like lighting and free software to resize digital photos. This lecture includes a slideshow and handouts. and a demonstration of how to create a professional quality photographer's set-up at an affordable price.




