Please check that the items are usable. Please do not place materials there that should have been put in the trash.

Unclaimed materials left after the end of the Tuesday morning meeting will be gathered for distribution to appropriate end users, recycled, or disposed of depending on their quality.

After a varied career in the design world, Jane began to quilt in

1980. She found that these "soft paintings" satisfied the draftsman, the craftsman, and the artist in her. Consequently, she is now a dedicated (some say "obsessed") quilt artist and fabric designer.

Her art quilts have been shown in many national and international exhibits, including Quilt National 1989 through 2005 and Contemporary American Quilts, the first major exhibit of American art quilts in England. Her quilt "Willow" was named as One of the One Hundred Best American Quilts of the Century. Jane is also the author of "The Quilted Garden". The book includes twenty years of her work and exercises for making nature-inspired quilts.

Jane's love for historic decorative arts can be seen in all facets of her work, but it is especially evident in the exuberant fabric she is currently designing for FreeSpirit. Her designs are oversized and colorful and have been coined as "William Morris on anti-depressants". They are created for quilts, wearables and home decorating. Her latest book, Patchwork Sassaman Style, beautifully illustrates her fabric "in action".

Marisa has been quilting since 2000 but she did not make her first art quilt until 2014.

After living in the United States for 7 years, Marisa and her husband moved back to Spain to help her parents with their sewing machine business and a way to modernize the business and they introduced quilting. Her base is self-taught, traditional quilting but, always by machine.

Marisa started experimenting with ideas, forms and textures and decided to create a wall quilt from one of her drawings and she discovered that she loved creating art quilts.

"I like surreal and symbolic compositions. I find out that I like to create something with hidden objects with a hidden meaning," Marisa cometed.


Lately she likes to use words to express an idea and she is inclined more often towards the abstract. It gives her more freedom to create.


Her quilts have been published in multiple books and magazines.






