Kathy Steere

Kathy Steere is an awardwinning artist who enjoys sharing her knowledge with others and genuinely wants her students to feel successful.

She tripped into quilting in 2007. It did not take long for her to realize matching points and accurate 1/4" seams were not in her future. Free-motion quilting, though, was drawing using a needle and a power tool.

Kathy will present two lectures and three workshops!

The evening lecture will be "Colored Wholecloth and More". This trunk show/power point presentation will "go behind the curtain" and show the process of making select art quilts. You'll see how several different techniques come together to make the final piece – and how sometimes the best results come from messing up!

What is "colored wholecloth"? There are three basic steps: I) Find/make a line drawing and transfer it to a single piece of cloth (taught in "The Illusion of Drawing" workshop).
2) "Poof" out selected areas using machine trapunto (see "Cookie Cutter Faux Trapunto" workshop).
3) Then pull out your inner child



and color! ("Color Blending Basics" workshop)

The morning lecture will be "Life is a River - one artist's tale".

No, I did not grow up quilting at my grandmother's side. Nor did I paint at my grandfather's knee You'll hear about some of the twists and turns that brought me to the point now of being an artist who quilts.

Kathy's 3 workshops will be:

- · The Illusion of Drawing
- Cookie Cutter Faux Trapunto
- Color Blending Basics

FEATURED BOARD POSITIONS

Over the next few months, we will be presenting (here and at the meetings) a short summary of what the board positions entail in hopes that you will, if asked, consider accepting a position on the board. Our nominations position is open for this new year.

Our fiscal year starts in June each year, with elections held in April.

Contracts/Programs:

The incumbent serves a twoyear term, the first as Contracts Chair, and the second as Program Vice-President. The purpose of this position is during the first year to contract for meeting speakers and workshop teachers, then during the second year oversee the execution of all programs and workshops.

Quilt Show Chair(s):

This position is responsible for the overall planning and execution of the biennial quilt show. It is not a board postion, but one that is appointed by the President.

Krista and I were chairs for the 2020 quilt show, which went virtual, and Mary joined us for 2022. Krista and I volunteered seperately, each saying we would do it but not alone. We didn't know one another before this started, but we've become friends through the process. Mary was a great helper in 2020, and Krista was pregnant, so we asked if Mary would help cover during "maternity leave" and she stayed with us.

I would describe this as an overall management position, with a fantastic team taking care of the 25

committees that make up the quilt show. You run the meetings, and make sure everyone has what they need to do their part.

Having I or 2 partners in this position is really great. We each have our speciality, and communication between us makes it all run smoothly.

I would encourage anyone who is interested to talk to us and shadow us at the quilt show to see what it's all about.

Planning for the 2024 show will start right away. In January 2023, you should get the next opportunity quilt selected and started. That's a real highlight of this position, getting to decide what the next quilt will look like and how the guild can be involved.

NEWSLETTER NEWS


Effective in January 2023, this newsletter will be changing. Starting with our January issue, it will be a biweekly blog on the PSQG website instead of a monthly newsletter.


